#### **Broadband update**

WODC is preparing to take on the lead role of delivering superfast broadband to the remaining 10 per cent of properties within our district, ensuring access for those in the most rural areas and the ones regarded as not being commercially viable. By taking on the procurement process WODC demonstrates it is absolutely committed to securing superfast broadband access for everyone in the district as soon as possible.

Cllr Colin Dingwall, Cabinet Member for Broadband at West Oxfordshire District Council, said:

"It is very disappointing that the Cotswolds Broadband's project failed after so much hard work. The delay for residents is really frustrating."



# Fresh Salmon and Lime Cakes (starter)

Another recipe from the lovely Donna Hay. This is from a very old Marie Claire Book called 'Flavours'. This is in the Lemon & Lime Section. I think it is great – tasty and simple, and from the reaction from my guests last week – I think they agreed!

Makes 18/20 small cakes, enough for 6 as a starter.

### Ingredients

### Salmon Cakes

500g Fresh salmon fillet, skinned and boned
1 large egg- white only
3 tbsp. fine rice flour
2 kaffir lime leaves (shredded)
1 tbsp. chopped fresh ginger
1 tbsp. wasabi paste
3 tbsp. chopped fresh parsley or coriander
Vegetable oil to shallow fry

### Lime Dipping Sauce

2 fl oz. lime juice 2 fl oz. soy sauce 2 tbsp. soft brown sugar Salad leaves for serving.

### Method

Check salmon for bones then cut into 1/4inch cubes. Put into a bowl and combine with egg white, rice flour, lime leaves, ginger, wasabi paste and chopped herbs.

Make lime dipping sauce by putting sugar into a jug, add lime juice and leave to steep for about 15 minutes. Stir occasionally. Once the sugar has dissolved, add the soy sauce. Mix and leave to one side.

If using straight away, heat the oil (about ½ inch) in a shallow frying pan over a medium heat. Take a desert spoon of the salmon mix and drop into the oil repeat to fill but not overcrowd the pan. Cook for about 45 seconds until golden, then carefully flip cakes over using a spoon and fork and cook for another 45 seconds until cooked through and golden on both sides. Remove from pan and place on a plate on a piece of kitchen roll/absorbent paper and keep warm in oven while you cook the rest of the mixture in the same way.

It is sometimes easier (or necessary) to prepare the cakes earlier (same day)

by spooning into 18-20 small cakes on a plate. Cover with cling film and keep refrigerated until needed. When ready to cook, remove from fridge for about 15

minutes before using, then when the oil is hot, carefully lift cakes with a spatula, add to oil then cook as above.

Serve immediately, decorated with the salad leaves and the dipping sauce – you can serve the dipping sauce in a jug handed round or in small bowls on each plate.

**Notes:** Wasabi paste is available in a tube from most supermarkets. It is very hot so be careful not to add too much! Rice Flour is also available readily but definitely from any Thai supermarket (great one in Witney on the corner of Church Green). Kaffir lime leaves are available dried from the supermarket herb sections or you can buy them fresh or frozen from a Thai supermarket and just use them straight from the freezer.
