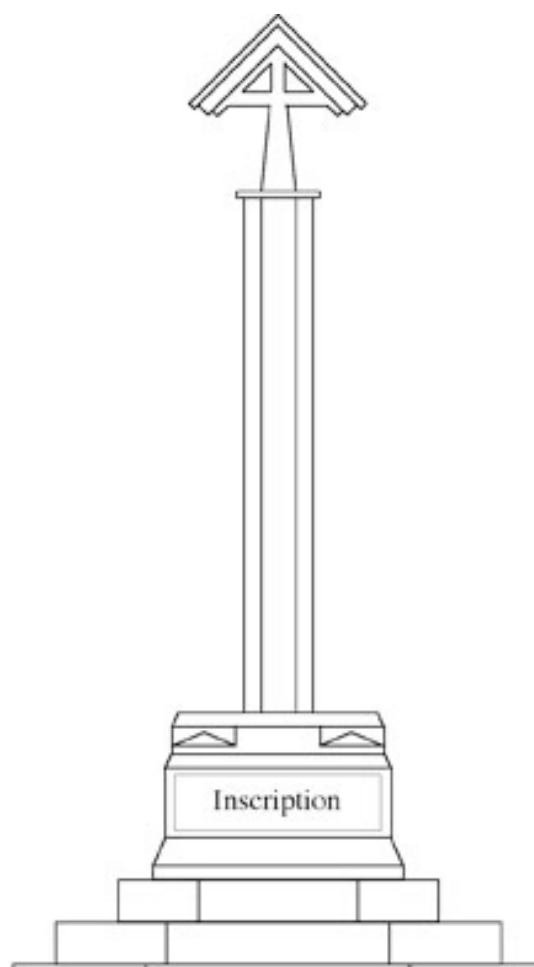
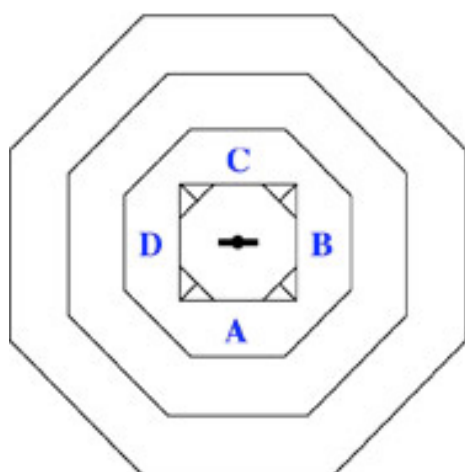

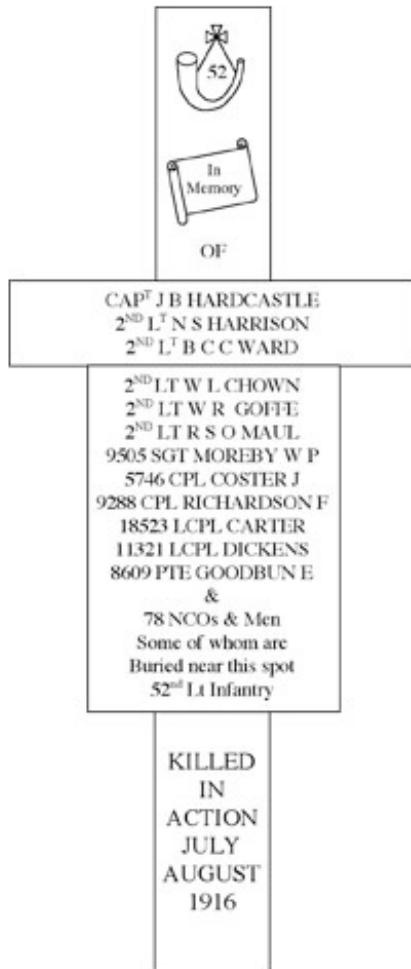

Battlefield Cross

Within the church is a First World War wooden battlefield cross. It was originally erected in fields near Guillemont, France, but was brought to the church for preservation, with the authority and permission of the graves committee and Officers of the 52nd Regiment.
