Given that the first combine was out before the end of July this seems a bit late this year – but please do come along for one of the key days in the village and Church year.

The Oneira Trio

Over 75 people were treated to another superb display of musicianship from the Oneira Trio on their third visit to St Peters Filkins. It has been a pleasure to see their careers develop over the past four years since they first visited us, with Emily founding a harp ensemble for schoolchildren in South Wales which has played at the Junior Proms at the Royal Albert Hall, Isabelle continuing to win awards for her solo flute playing as well as playing with the LSO, and Elliot becoming one of the leading chamber musicians in Europe. The evening raised a very useful £600 to go towards the costs of the upcoming works on the floor (see below) and thank you to all those who came - it was a wonderful evening.

V J Day – 80th Anniversary

You may have noticed that the Remembrance Silhouettes were out again for the 15th August and hopefully visited Swinford Museum on Sunday 17th, whilst the war in the Pacific Theatre 80 years ago might seem impossibly remote, there are direct connections to the village.



Christopher Harrison: moved to the village upon his retirement around 1981, living at Anstruther until shortly before his death in 2013 at the grand old age of 99. Before WWII he had been in the Colonial Service in Africa, on the outbreak of war he joined the Volunteer Reserve of the West African Frontier Force. He was posted to the 7th Battalion, Nigeria Regiment in 1940 and between then and the start of 1943 spent long periods patrolling the north in anticipation of an attack by the Vichy French. In early 1943 General Orde Wingate's Chindits had begun operations in Burma and he required troops used to jungle conditions, as a result the 7NR were mobilised, sent to India and began training for operations. In April 1944 the main group for the second Chindit Force were dropped by glider into the heart of Burma with the task of disrupting Japanese communications. Immediately on arrival Christopher was transferred from commanding his company to become Brigade Major at Henu, those duties won him a Mention in Despatches.

After a month conducting guerrilla operations around Henu the entire Chindit force was ordered to fight its way north through the jungle to join up with a Chinese force under General Stilwell. This was carried out over the next three months through atrocious jungle conditions with many of the officers and men succumbing to sickness, among them was Christopher. Once recovered, he rejoined the 7NR as battalion commander before returning to the UK on leave and then rejoining the Colonial Service.

Reggie Heslewood: with his wife Doreen 'Dorki' lived in Vine Cottage for over 30 years until their deaths in 1990 & 2011 respectively. At the outbreak of war Reggie joined the Royal Artillery as a gunner but was quickly commissioned. In early 1942 he boarded RMS Orion with a force intended to bolster Singapore, however it fell before their arrival and they were diverted to India to train for jungle warfare, eventually joining the 20th Indian Division. In March 1944 the Japanese attempted to invade India through Kohima and Imphal, leading to 3 months of vicious fighting which Reggie joined. He wrote long letters to Dorki every day while he was away except during those three months when his location had to be kept secret. He refused to come home on leave to see Dorki and their daughter Jennifer as going back to the fighting would have been too hard. Major Heslewood was one of a small team responsible for organising the logistics and was later mentioned in Despatches for his bravery. He was warmly remembered by the troops he commanded, but the effects of his time in India and Burma left mental scars on him for the rest of his life. Two more daughters were born to Reggie and Dorki after the war - Carolyn and Juliet.

Dorki was an actress before the war, went to France with ENSA in 1940 and was there on 10th May when Germany invaded. Her theatre company had to rush to Boulogne from where they were evacuated on 22nd May shortly before the town fell.

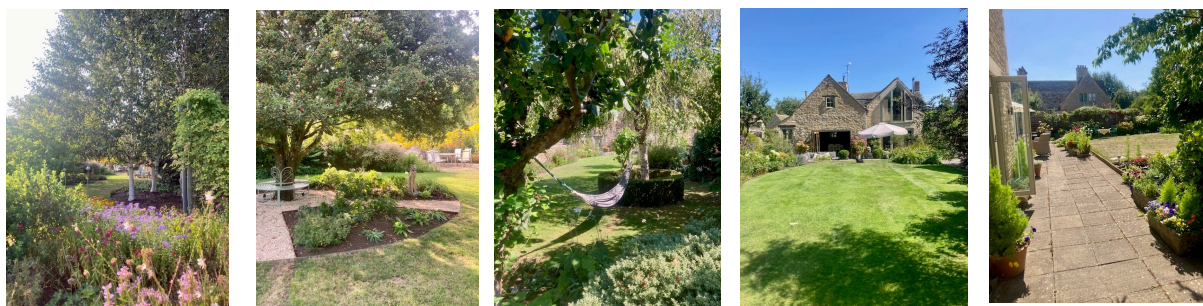
Jennifer married the actor Freddie Jones and their eldest son is actor Toby Jones. Juliet was married at the church in Broughton Poggs where Reggie and Dorki are now buried - together with all his letters.

Victor Drake Colville: the father of a Filkins resident Daina Maaldrink was a 27 year old Lieutenant in the Royal Navy in 1945, serving in the second assault group force 'W' R.N. H.Q. Saigon. He was the first to open the gates of one of the Japanese p.o.w. camps, witnessing the appalling conditions the prisoners had lived in and was present when the Japanese surrendered their swords in Saigon in September 1945.

John Smith: father of Colin Barry-Smith joined the Royal Engineers in 1944, aged 23, joining the 14th Army under General 'Bil' Slim, serving in Burma, India, Singapore & Malaysia. In 1946 he helped in the construction of a Bailey Bridge crossing between Malaysia & Singapore, replacing one blown up by the British in 1942 during the Japanese invasion.

As we hopefully get more rain, our gardens should be showing some autumn colour, if they have survived the summer that is.

In August the Gardening club Safari was enjoyed by members on a beautiful sunny day. We Visited three very different gardens all wondrous in that they were defying the drought conditions and looked stunning. Thank you to those who opened their gardens and for the lovely tea at the end of the afternoon.



Despite the lack of water, the Flower and Produce show had a marvellous range of exhibits and was a great success. Well done to the organisers! It really shows how folk can come up with such an eclectic mix of crafts, cake, flowers, fruit and vegetables.

Early September sees members' last get together of the year when we will bring plants for the plant stall at the village fete on 6th September. We will also have a 'guess the number of beans' quiz with a prize, and a team organising welly wanging.



For Dahlia enthusiasts Badminton gardens are open on 7th 10.00-3.00 I went earlier in the year and it was stunning.

Final date for the diary is Sunday October 19th volunteer bulb planters needed from 10.30, bulbs supplied – more details next month.

- Divide herbaceous perennials
- Pick autumn raspberries
- Collect and sow seeds from perennials and hardy annuals
- Dig up remaining potatoes before the slugs get them
- Start to reduce frequency of houseplant watering
- Clean out cold frames and greenhouses
- Start to plant spring flowering bulbs

Having been cancelled last year for the first time in 75 years due to waterlogged ground, this year's show promises a perfect day out for families seeking authentic countryside entertainment. At the heart of the show, skilled ploughmen will compete in traditional furrow- cutting competitions, demonstrating time honoured techniques, using both vintage tractors and magnificent heavy horses. The main ring will buzz with excitement throughout the day with falconry and gundog demonstrations, terrier racing, hound parade, the Gateridge Suffolk heavy horses and a tractor & machinery parade of old and new. Visitors can explore the craft tent where local artisans display and sell their creations. Take a wander through the Homecraft competitions (which are open to all) encouraging participation across various categories. The bar and food outlets will ensure no one goes hungry or thirsty and for the first time mobility scooters are available to help navigate the showground comfortably. 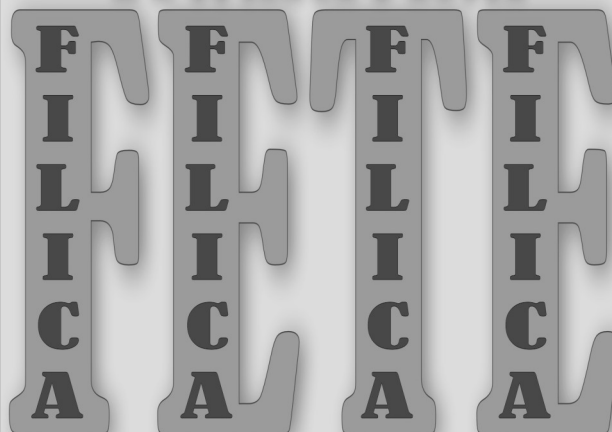

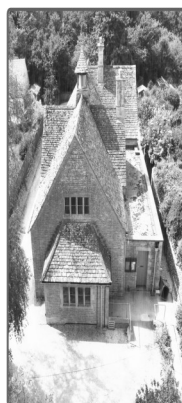
