2. **Minutes of AGM 2025**

The minutes of the AGM of 4 February 2025 were accepted by Cris Hoad and seconded by Tony Woodford.

The Treasurer presented the finance report and advised that we had made a loss of £1,865 in 2025 as there had been no major fund raising event and we had running costs of around £3,300 pa.

In response to a question from Lorraine Chitty, she advised that the retained funds were set aside for replacements and repairs to the gazebos and for repairs to the storage sheds on Hardcastles field. The £1000 set aside for the Trustees was there to cover debts should St Filica cease to exist.

The Filkins Bowls Club had submitted a request for funds to the amount of £250 for seed and top dressing for the playing surface. This was the only bid received and was unanimously accepted by the membership in a show of hands.

The Treasurer's report was accepted by Ian Grey and seconded by Freda Shrouder.

5. Election of Trustees, Officers and Other Committee Members for 2024/5

The existing Trustees (Andy Hoad, Jeremy Irwin Singer, Jane Martin and Sue Hitchcock) had kindly agreed to continue in office. This was agreed by the membership.

Appendix 1 - Chairman's Report 2025

Good evening everyone, and thank you for coming along. It's wonderful to see so many of you here for our AGM. Looking back over the past year, it's striking just how much this village can pull off when we all get stuck in together.

We began back in March with the Quiz and Curry Night - always a favourite - and this year's Queen Connections was particularly memorable. I'm still not sure whether people were more delighted by the clever links or baffled by them, but it certainly kept the room buzzing.

In May we celebrated VE Day in proper style: a swing band, fish and chips, and a crowd ready to dance, chat and enjoy the atmosphere. It was one of those evenings where the whole village felt alive.

Then came the summer fete. After a week of torrential rain, we somehow found ourselves blessed with a perfectly timed break in the weather. The result was a wonderfully traditional fete - with the notable exception of the maggot racing, which was anything but traditional. The Witney Silver Band lifted everyone's spirits, and it turned into one of the most cheerful afternoons of the year.

Our autumn Quiz and Curry Night was equally memorable, not least because we managed to drink the keg dry. Whether that's a sign of enthusiasm or a lesson in stock-planning, I'll leave for you to decide.

I also want to take a moment to thank three committee members who are stepping down this year: Denise, Alison and Amy. Each of them has given a huge amount of time, energy and good humour to St Filica, and we're enormously grateful for everything they've done.

Their departure does mean we have space - and a real need - for new volunteers. If you'd like to help shape the events we run, or lend a hand with organising them, we'd be delighted to have you join the committee. It's rewarding, it's sociable, and it genuinely makes a difference to village life.

Now, I could stand here and list every person who's helped make this year such a success... but we'd be here all night, and I'd inevitably forget someone. So instead, let

We had some great events this year with only Father Christmas making a loss. However our currently running costs are about £3,300 and without a major funding raising event in 2025 we have made a loss for the year of £1,865.

Events

- ✦ Quiz (March and October) - £704.
- ✦ VE Day - £514. Due to a grant secured from the National Lottery
- ✦ Gazebo Hire - £978.
- ✦ Fete - £83.29. The bar covered the cost of the band. Profit came from donations from a couple of the stalls.
- ✦ Membership and donations - £158.
- ✦ Father Christmas (£293). We received very generous donations this year of £139 however the tree was £350.
- ✦ Calendar – breakeven.

Major Costs

- ✦ Insurance - £910 required for all our events and was also used for the village to cover the fete in 2025
- ✦ Newsletter - £1,675. This is a major cost however we believe it is worth it and it enables the whole village to stay connected.
- ✦ Other costs

- o Hardcastle's Field – £290
- o Village website - £180

As you can see from the summary we are currently holding funds of £8,100, with £1,000 Trustees fund and £2,400 Marquee fund leaving £4,700 retained. We are stilling looking to replace our 10 x 4 gazebo as it is a poor state or repair and we will need to ensure that we have funds to cover the ball upfront costs and the running costs. Therefore we would like to recommend a bid fund of £250.
